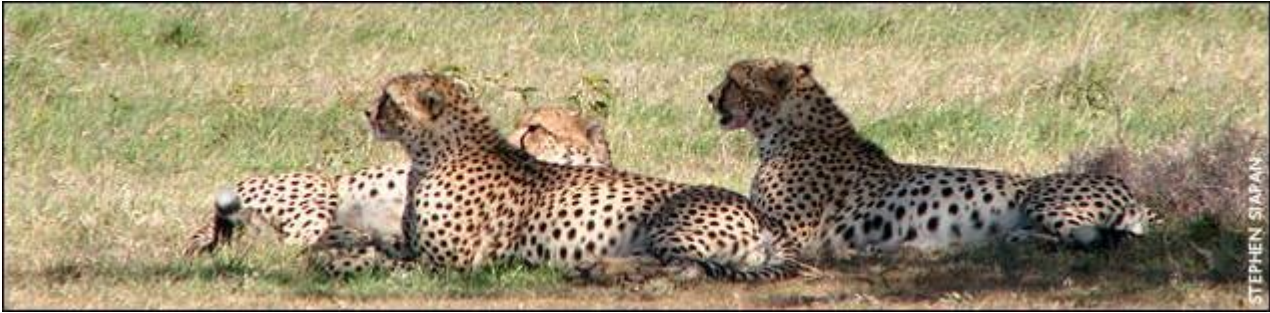


## Cheetah Numbers Bounce Back at the Ol Pejeta Conservancy

The Ol Pejeta Conservancy is delighted to announce an increase in cheetah numbers as a result of new births and the improved survival rate of cubs. There are now 15 confirmed individuals being monitored by the conservancy's predator research team. Cheetahs are among the rarest of the big cats with only about 12,500 left in the wild, making this announcement **VERY GOOD NEWS**.

A female with 4 newborn cubs was the most recent and exciting of discoveries. A mother and daughter team and another solitary female, make up the rest of the female contingent on the conservancy. Male cheetahs include a single male and 2 coalitions of three individuals each, one consisting of three sub-adult brothers.

The Ol Pejeta conservancy has additionally experienced a 15% annual increase in all wildlife numbers over the last three years.
